**Learn how this disorder works in the body.**

Opioid use disorder affects the brain, and it can affect anyone. But it can be managed with medication alongside other tools.



**Support people who are in treatment.**

Taking prescribed medications for opioid use disorder is not the same as being dependent on opioids off the street. It's safer and allows people to work on recovery.



**Look for Native-centered care.**

If you or someone in your life is ready for treatment, look for a program that blends MOUD with other clinical and Native health care practices.
